PRESIDENT'S REPORT 1977.

Each year the C.C.S.A. seems to become more and more involved in a greater variety of activities connected with soccer in this area. This year has been no exception.

We have played games against Sydney, St. George; we enjoyed a visit from a senior West German team and recently we entertained the Port Moresby Under 15 side for 10 days.

This year has seen the appointment of Alan Vest as Northern N.S.W. State Coach with the result that a coaching clinic has been set-up and courses will now be conducted on a regular basis on the Coast. This must improve our standards in the years to come.

During the year, negotiations have been under way with the intention of purchasing an area of land to be used as a sports complex. At the moment an application for planning permission is with the Wyong Shire Council. This project must be pursued to give us all year round facilities and a place to call our own.

The Ladies Association has now blossomed into an independent body with their own competition and is firmly established as part of soccer on the Central Coast. Thanks must go to Irene Sneyd and her executives for their hard work.

This year, the Senior Committee has played a more dominant role in publicising and promoting the code.

In the State Amateur Cup of 24 clubs, 7 teams from the Central Coast took part with the eventual winners being Southern United with Wyong as runners-up.

Our sincere thanks must go to our sponsors; the Central Coast Leagues Club for the use of their meeting rooms and their unqualified support; to Radio 2GG for help and publicity; to Norman Ross Discounts; Springfresh Dry Cleaners and Caspi Shoes. I exhort all soccer people to support these businesses because without them our job would be much more of a burden.

My personal thanks to Roger Smith and his committee who handled the Seniors and publicity; to John Fairweather and the members of the Judiciary; to Uel Mellish who carried out the thankless task of Secretary; to Trevor Leggett and George Licence for their assistance; to Neville Hills who looked after our finances; to Don Paterson our fixtures Officer; to Ken McLaughlin who guided our Rep. Squads; to all the officers of the various sub-committees for their efforts; to our Referees who controlled our games; to the club delegates and to all clubs who, by their support, make the Soccer Association a force to be reckoned with. Without this hard of willing workers we would achieve very little and our efforts would be in vain.

My wishes for the future:- that the Soccer Complex becomes a reality; that the coaching continues to improve; that the co-operation between clubs continues; and that smaller clubs in the same area amalgamate to form stronger units for the benefit of all concerned.

Thank you one and all for your support. I wish you all a very happy and successful year in 1978.

I would also like to thank all our sponsors and a big thanks to the Central Coast Leagues who always support our code and to the Manager and Staff, especially David Bacon of 2GG for their big part they played in helping me in my other position as Publicity and Promotions Officer such as our annual game which raised \$600 for charity, Faithaven School, which the Association received a lot of publicity as well as helping the less fortunate. Just to close I would like to say that this association has a long way to go and with the right guidance and support from all clubs, so once again thanks to all and the best of luck to all clubs for the 1978 season.

SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The 1977 Season has again indicated the increased growth and strength of teams in the Central Coast. Junior Players now have the opportunity of advancing to the new Professional teams i.e. C.C.U. and Gosford Rangers.

The year did not pass without some problems i.e. Player-referee relationships - irate spectators - forfeited games - team withdrawals etc. These points can best be resolved with a closer relationship with all parties and a better form of communications with clubs, associations and players.

The proposed Complex at Wyong is still in the negotiating stage, with the C.C.S.A. making a counter offer of \$27,000 to the owners. Plans are currently being drafted for submission to Council for approval. We refused the Vendors demand that interest to the sum of \$300-400 per month be paid pending settlement.

Finally may I convey my thanks to my Co-Executive for their assistance and co-operation during the year.

FIXTURE OFFICER'S REPORT.

I would like everyone to have a close look at this years list of number of teams registered. There were 178 teams registered at the start of the season and only 162 teams left in at the end of the season. In other words 16 teams were withdrawn or disqualified through competition rules.

There was also a total of 41 forfeit games which is far too many. I feel that clubs must submit a list of 10 players for every team registered as was the case a few years ago. Also I think we should introduce fines to clubs who nominate teams and then either withdraw them at a later date or forfeit games. With 16 teams withdrawing it necessitated a redraw of two divisions namely the thirteens and sixteens and caused reprinting of the complete draw which thankfully went over without too many complaints thankfully.

A number of clubs were a bit late phoning in results which should be remembered that every club has to phone in the results of all their teams whether they play at home or away on the day of the game not 3 days later as happened in one case.

With the use of the answering service made my job so much easier with all the clubs able to contact me any time. Previous fixture Officers have complained of abusive phone calls and calls at all hours of the night. This year I had only one angry call for this I thank clubs for a very tolerable season.

Once again after a few years lapse we were able to reap results and point-scores every week in Thursday's Express, I hope this continues for all ensuing seasons.

There were a lot of complaints about referees refereeing non-competition

games and not competition games. This came about with referees covering grounds with the most games and also a shortage of referees. These can be eliminated if we increase all A Divisions to 10 teams minimum with the remainder in B Divisions playing possibly three or four rounds. Finally I would like to thank my Assistants namely Derek Whetnall (whose sons all play rugby league) and Lenny Loan as without them my job would have been virtually impossible.

Following this report is a complete record for the season.

REPRESENTATIVE ORGANISER'S REPORT

Teams contested the State Championships from Under 10's to Seniors. All teams played well with the Seniors once again taking the honours. This year saw the Northern Rivers Area split into three smaller areas thus making a Round-Robin style of event unpracticable. Two separate divisions were formed with the winners of each division playing in the final.

Preparation of teams was once again a problem due to time, availability of top players, lack of qualified coaches and facilities. If the standard of soccer in this area is to improve greater co-operation must be achieved between all players, clubs, coaches and the association.

During the season several games were played against teams from the Sydney area and following the State Championship, Central Coast teams played the N.W.S.W. State Squads.

A Youth Squad from Port Macquarie was billeted in the area and played several matches, this visit was a resounding success from both the social and sporting aspects.

Two coaching courses were organised, the first being cancelled due to lack of support. The second, under Allan Vest, proved successful though only half of the initial registration attended the course. Coaches must attend these courses if the game is to progress.

Finally, congratulations to all players who were selected in the Representative Squads both local and state, well done boys. Many thanks to the representative organizing committee, coaches, managers and parents for the time and effort that was freely given during the season.

Players, parents and officials associated with the Representative Squads must be mindful that their behaviour both on and off the field must at all times be of the highest standard as any misdemeanour can reflect on the Association as a whole.
