Brian Nash was born at Birmingham, England 1936. He immigrated to Victoria 1939 where he played AFL from 1948-1953. He moved to Sydney 1957 and became the Secretary of the Newtown Junior Rugby League Club for 5 years 1967-1971. He moved to the Blue Mountains and was President of the Blue Mountains Rugby League Association from 1974-1977 (4 years).

At the end of 1977, he moved to the Central Coast. He joined the Killcare Surf Club.

In 1982 he became involved in women's soccer due to a friendship with Pat Moffitt, who was already heavily involved with the women's soccer. He became the Secretary of Northern NSW Women's

Soccer Association and held the position for 14 years (1982-1995). At the same time he was involved with the Central Coast Women's Soccer Association. He was required to take over the reins of Secretary in 1983, when mismanagement was discovered after an investigation by NNSWWSA. From 1984-2001 he held one position or another, notably President 1991, 1995, 1996 (three years), Secretary 1989-1997 (nine years), Vice President 1986, 1987 (two years). He was the Delegate to Gosford Sports Council for 15 years from 1987-2001 and Rep team Canteen Coordinator for five years from 1997-2001. Brian was honoured with Life Membership of the CCWSA in 1993 and with the NNSWWSA.

Brian Nash has been a tireless worker, behind the scenes, for the women's fraternity for 20 years. He has seen the women's side of the sport grow and grow to what it is today one of the fastest growing sports in Australia.
