

# Peter Tierney

Life Member CCWSA 2000



Peter Tierney was born in Newtown, Sydney 1951. He first was involved with soccer at the Hurlstone Park Wanderers Soccer Football Club (HPWSFC) 1977 in Sydney. He was with the Club for 12 years from 1977-1988 when he was, also, a member on the Board of the Canterbury District Soccer Association. At HPWSFC he held positions of Secretary, President and coached various teams. He also played cricket with the soccer Club's cricket team.

He came to The Entrance 1989 where he immediately was involved with the Women's All Aged teams for 1989 and 1990. He then transferred to the Toukley Club 1991 and sat on the general committee.

In 1995 Peter was voted into the Fixtures officer position on the Central Coast Women's Soccer Association (CCWSA) - a position he would hold for

six years until 2000. He was, also, Vice President in 1998.

Peter was also involved with the CCWSA junior development program which was set up (1996-2000) with Les Place and Sharon Dewar (an Australian representative). He considered the 2000 Central Coast U16 Rep team to be the best team which he had coached particularly when most of the players were U14. The team played in the local U16 competition as a development team, the Sydney Inter Zone Friday night competition, U14 NNSW State Titles, The Proctor Cup at Bathurst, The Kanga Cup U16 in Canberra (Runners Up), the Champion of Champions U14 at Valentine Park, Parklea and the North Harbour Cup at Manly (Runners Up). Peter was awarded Life Membership of the CCWSA in 2000 for outstanding services rendered to the code and its development.

From 1996, Peter was involved with Toukley women's teams and in 2003 he returned to The Entrance Club where he has been coaching women's teams, and been on their committee as Women's Vice President, President, Fixtures and is currently Registrar. 2009 saw Peter on the Board of Central Coast Football as the Director of Women's Football. Peter received Life membership from The Entrance Club in 2011.

Peter Tierney is a very passionate worker of the game. He has been involved since 1975 and still as enthusiastic. His contribution has been significant.

Peter sadly passed away on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> December 2017. He was still an active committee member of The Entrance Bateau Bay Football Club.
